17th November 2024 - 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear friends,

Welcome to Our Lady Help of Christians. Everyone is welcome, no matter who you are or where you are on your faith journey.

As we approach the end of the Church's Liturgical Year, our readings this Sunday invite us to reflect on the "end times", the second coming of Jesus.

On one level the readings are not very reassuring or encouraging. Daniel talks of 'a time of great distress, unparalleled since nations first came into existence'. Jesus also describes a time when the sun will be darkened, the moon will lose its brightness, stars will fall from the sky, and the heavens shaken. Despite this bleak picture there is hope.

Things will change but we should not be afraid of changes. We are challenged to believe in the Resurrection. Every time we recite the Creed, we profess our belief that Jesus Christ 'will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end'.

Paul tells us in his letter to the Hebrews, that Jesus offered one sacrifice for sins, and took his seat forever at the right hand of God. Jesus has saved us. As Jesus promised his followers: 'The Son of Man coming in the clouds will send his angels to gather his chosen from the ends of the world'.

It is not for us to attempt to predict when the Second Coming will happen. That is a futile exercise. We live in the present, not the future. The decisions we make today, the way we respond to God's love for us and the way we express our love for our neighbour that will determine our place in God's kingdom.

Despite any anxiety we may have, the end of the Liturgical Year is a time to trust in God's word and to look forward to the joy of Advent and Christmas.

WORLD YOUTH DAY Next week we will celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, which is also celebrated as World Youth Day. It is a day, promoted by Pope Francis, to encourage every Catholic faith community around the world to celebrate and reflect on youth and young adults annually on the Feast of Christ the King.

BISHOPS' STATEMENT ON ASSISTED SUICIDE. The Catholic Bishops of England, Wales and Scotland have issued a statement on Assisted Suicide ahead of the Second Reading of the Terminally III Adults (End of Life) Bill. In it, the bishops explain exactly what 'compassion' means at the end of life – caring for and accompanying people, particularly during times of suffering. The statement also strongly defends the vulnerable in society who are at risk through this proposed legislation, and the bishops advocate for better funded palliative care to be consistently available to everyone in need.
