9th March 2025 - 1st Sunday in Lent

Dear friends,

Welcome to Our Lady Help of Christians. Everyone is welcome, no matter who you are or where you are on your faith journey.

If you own a vehicle, you will be aware of the importance of the MOT test and an annual service. They ensure that the vehicle meets minimum safety and environmental standards, operates at optimal levels of performance and efficiency and prevents future mechanical faults that can be expensive and hazardous.

In the same way, we need to pause and reassess our relationship with God. The season of Lent is an opportunity and invitation to examine our lives in detail, spending time to reflect upon our thoughts, words and deeds, on where we have strayed from God and to ask his forgiveness.

The first reading today from the Book of Deuteronomy sets the tone. Moses reminds the people how God delivered them from slavery in Egypt. During their wanderings in the desert, they were tested and at times they turned from God. Despite their failings, God finally brought them to the Promised Land when the put their trust in him.

All of us have at times been in the wilderness and we have been tried and tempted. Jesus knows what it is like to be tempted. The Gospel Reading invites us to reflect on the time Jesus spent in the wilderness and the temptations he experienced. Jesus resisted the temptations, and Paul assures us that we will be saved from falling into temptation and retain that close relationship with God if we call on the name of the Lord and keep him in our heart and on our lips.

We can take comfort from knowing that God's love for us is ever present in our pain, our sufferings, our difficulties and when we are tempted. We bring our struggles to the Lord, asking for his help, knowing that he will be there to take us by the hand.
