# 23rd March 2025 - 3rd Sunday in Lent

Dear friends,

Welcome to Our Lady Help of Christians. Everyone is welcome, no matter who you are or where you are on your faith journey.

Today's Gospel presents us with the imagery of the barren fig tree. It starts by reminding us that we should not judge when misfortune or tragedies happen to other people. What Jesus does make clear in the opening sentences of this passage is that there no direct corelation between suffering and sin. Our focus should be on what we need to do in our lives so that we bear fruit.

We can take comfort that God focuses on the plants that are struggling. God gives us everything we need to allow us to bear fruit and reach our full potential, but it does call for a response from us. The analogy with the fig tree is a gentle reminder that God does not give up on us: he is the dedicated gardener caring for his plants. This is an expression of God's love for us.

Last week, on the mountain we heard God say: 'This is my Son: Listen to him'. Listening to the word of God calls for a response, the 'Here I am Lord. It is I Lord'. When Moses heard God calling him from the burning bush, he answered 'Here I am'. What is our response when God calls us. Standing still is not an option for Jesus's disciples.

We can only listen if we are prepared like Moses to respond. Moses sets out for Egypt and the challenge of convincing Pharoah to release the people. We are called to repentance and the challenge of delivering the world from slavery to sin. How are we doing?

The story is also a warning: we must be ready and receptive to the graces God gives us. It offers a choice: change and be reconciled with God or perish. God is patient, there is time, Lent is such a time, for repentance to bear fruit, but there is a limit.
