9th February 2025 - The 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear friends,

Welcome to Our Lady Help of Christians. Everyone is welcome, no matter who you are or where you are on your faith journey.

Through our Baptism we become members of the Body of Christ, the Church. As such we are called to be active participants in the mission of the Church, to proclaim the good news of salvation and to witness in our lives to the presence of God in the world. This Sunday, the readings invite us to reflect on how Jesus calls us to follow him, and what we are doing to respond to that call.

A commentator described this Sunday as 'Excuses Sunday'. This strikes a chord. There will be times when we may be less enthusiastic, less motivated, or hesitant, in our engagement in the life of the Church. We come up with excuses to explain that lack of engagement: I am not qualified, gifted, have the confidence, temperament, or skill set necessary for the tasks involved.

In the readings this Sunday, Isaiah, Paul and Peter feel they have very good excuses for not accepting God's call. Isaiah says he is 'a man of unclean lips.' Paul felt that he was unworthy to be an Apostle, because he 'persecuted the Church of God', and Simon Peter confesses that he is 'a sinful man'. We can relate to their sense of being unworthy of the mission God is giving them. We can also take comfort from their discomfort.

First, we should not pretend to be something we are not. God loves us where we are, with all our faults, failings, and weaknesses. God knows us better than we know ourselves. God will consider us worthy and that is all that counts. What is important is how we respond to God's invitation.

If we put our complete faith and trust in God, he will transform our lives. Paul points the way: from persecutor of the Church, he 'worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me'. In the passage from the Gospel the climax is not the size of the catch but Simon Peter's response; he leaves everything to follow Jesus. Our lives will be transformed if we trust in God, listen to Jesus and answer his call.

Despite any reservations, we should trust in God, and shout with Isaiah "Here I am! Send me'.
