19th January 2025 - 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear friends.

Welcome to Our Lady Help of Christians. Everyone is welcome, no matter who you are or where you are on your faith journey.

Weddings are one of the happier occasions which bring family, loved ones and friends together. They are a joyful celebration of family, of love, of commitment, of friendship. They are an important element in creating and supporting family relationships.

The wedding feast in Cana is a familiar story. It marks the first public miracle worked by Jesus and places Jesus at the centre of family life. We know the names of some of the guests – Mary, Jesus, and his disciples – but the names of the bridal party are not recorded. Instead, the focus of the story is on the interaction between Mary and her Son. The passage tells us much about their relationship.

Although a guest at the wedding celebration, Mary notices that the wine, a key ingredient to the festivities, is running low. What we see is her compassion and concern for the needs of others. What does she do? She takes the problem to her Son, and Jesus performs his first miracle at her request.

What is central to the story is Mary's faith and complete trust in her Son. The wedding at Cana is the start of Christ's ministry, and yet Mary is fully confident that he can help them. Her words to the servants resonate for us. 'Do whatever he tells you'.

Like the water, our lives can be transformed if we put Jesus at the centre of it and ask Mary to intercede for us with her Son. The miracle at Cana also shows us that God is involved in all aspects of our lives.

Last Sunday we celebrated the Baptism of the Lord. As a result of our Baptism the Holy Spirit gifts each of us a distinct gift which we are to use for the benefit and service of others.

The list which Paul presents in the second reading is not exhaustive. What is important is that we use the gifts of the Holy Spirit, the gifts the Holy Spirit has given to us individually, to build up and support the community.
